The goal of relocating the Chamber office for better visibility and access was accomplished this past August. Then the hard work began!!

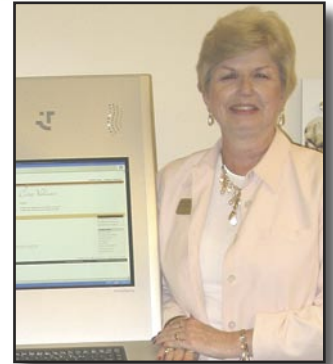
Our good member Daryl Anderson of Wikiup Properties took on the remodeling project and directed all of the contractors. ***Thank you, Daryl,*** for a job well done!

We had contractors build new walls in part of the interior. *continued on Page 4*

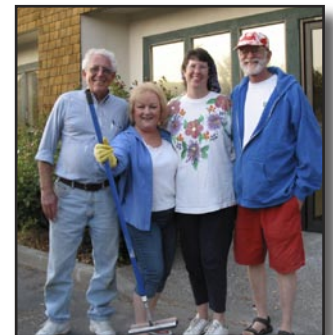



**FYI: Cal/EPA Advisory Committee**

*Releases Draft of Greenhouse Gas Reduction Report  
CalChamber Emphasizes Benefits of Using Market Forces*

An advisory committee for the California Environmental Protection Agency (Cal/EPA) has released draft recommendations for the design of a cap-and-trade system to reduce greenhouse gas emissions in California.

Winston Hickox, chair of Cal/EPA's Market Advisory Committee, said a comprehensive approach would be needed to meet the Governor's greenhouse gas targets and get the most reductions in the quickest timeframe at the lowest cost.



"Ultimately, the Air Resources Board (ARB) will decide whether to include market-based compliance mechanisms in a comprehensive greenhouse gas emissions reduction program," Hickox said.

AB 32 (Núñez; D-Los Angeles), the landmark greenhouse gas reduction law signed by Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger last year, requires the state to reduce its greenhouse gas emissions to 1990 levels by 2020. The ARB is in charge of monitoring and enforcing regulations to implement the program, which will require an accurate measurement of both the tons of greenhouse gases emitted in California in 1990 and the current level of emissions.

**Market Approach Best**

Upon the release of the advisory committee's draft report, California Chamber of Commerce President Allan Zaremborg issued a statement highlighting the benefits of using market forces to reduce greenhouse gas emissions cost-effectively:

"California has set aggressive goals to reduce greenhouse gas emissions in the coming years," Zaremborg said. "Using the innovation and

efficiency of market forces to attack this challenge is essential if we are to meet these environmental goals, minimize the impact on consumers and ensure a strong economy in California. Markets are the most cost-effective way to reduce greenhouse gas emissions throughout the world, delivering the most carbon reductions per dollar spent."

**Cap-and-Trade Systems**

Zaremborg recapped remarks by Harvard Professor Robert Stavins at a recent meeting of the AB 32 Implementation Group, a business working group spearheaded by the CalChamber and California Manufacturers and Technology Association that is dedicated to a fair and effective implementation of AB 32.

Stavins said that cap-and-trade market systems:

- can be more environmentally effective and more cost-effective than conventional approaches;
- have a track record of achieving both environmental goals and cost savings; and
- create a common currency of emission credits that make it possible to link systems in different jurisdictions.

Zaremborg said: "We look forward to analyzing the report and working with the administration to implement the law in a way that leads to a coordinated global solution — a way that is fair to both environmental protections and ensuring a strong economy so that other states, the federal government and other countries will embrace and adopt our approach. To do otherwise risks not only hurting consumers and damaging our economy, but leaving California isolated in what would become a futile attempt to affect this global issue alone."

**Sonoma County Airport Express**

Founded in 1980, **Airport Express** has been the premier bus service for Sonoma County business and leisure air travelers. The company has gone through a few changes throughout the years - although one constant has always been their commitment to providing a quality service for residents and visitors of Sonoma County.

Initially established as a scheduled bus service to and from **San Francisco International Airport**, **Airport Express** has since ventured into other areas of transportation. In 1998 they began scheduled service for passengers traveling out of the **Port of San Francisco** on cruise ships to Alaska, Mexico and the Panama Canal. In 2001, **Airport Express** offered Sonoma County the option of connecting with flights at **Oakland International Airport**. Throughout the years, groups have chartered **Airport Express** buses to Bay Area sporting events, concerts and various other destinations of interest. Presently **Airport Express** operates 19 round trips a day for San Francisco International Airport and 10 trips a day for Oakland International Airport.

The corporate offices and yard are located at **5807 Old Redwood Highway** between Shiloh Road and Fulton Road. **Airport Express** currently has a staff of 61 employees and a fleet of 20 buses. Employees include bus drivers, bus washers, and technicians along with management and office staff. The average employee has been with the company for over 12 years. *“In the early years drivers would come to work for us and then go drive for another company. We’ve completely reversed that trend. Now very seldom does a bus driver ever leave Airport Express for greener pastures”*, said **General Operations Manager Tony Geraldi**. *“Our employees are what makes the difference as they are by far our greatest asset”*. A 20 year employee himself, Tony regularly attends chamber functions representing **Airport Express**.

Ironically enough it was only recently that **Airport Express** became a member of the **Mark West Area Chamber of Commerce**.

Geraldi says *“For years we have been members of the Chambers of Commerce in Santa Rosa, Rohnert Park and Petaluma. In the short time we have been members the Mark West Chamber this has become my favorite chamber to be associated with. Besides, our company is here in the Larkfield / Mark West area. **FYI: Workplace Health**

To enhance workplace productivity, mental clarity and to reduce stress, daily eat a well-balanced diet of at least five servings of fruits and vegetables and a variety of wholesome foods, including whole grain foods. The importance of breakfast, fiber, protein from legumes or lean meats, limit of alcohol, avoidance of tobacco, and adequate exercise cannot be emphasized enough. One's ability to handle stress can be enhanced by proper nutrition.

Stress is intertwined with nutrition in part because stress can cause nutrient deficiencies. As reported by Nutritionist Elizabeth Somer, "Blood levels of several minerals dropped by as much as 33 percent and tissue stores for certain nutrients were depleted during a five-day Hell Week at work where employees were given extra work and asked to meet difficult deadlines." Stress triggers the release of stress hormones that increase magnesium loss through cells and urine. Conversely, a magnesium deficiency enhances the release of stress hormones and consequently exacerbates stress, causing irritability and stress-related depression.

Mineral deficiencies can stress the body. A deficiency of iron results in reduced oxygen to tissues and the brain, leaving one tired, irritable, and unable to concentrate. Deficiencies of vitamin C and beta-carotene promote the risk of tissue damage due to thwarted antioxidant defense. Physical and emotional stress can suppress the immune system. Inadequate B vitamins inhibit the ability of the body to convert fats and carbohydrates into energy. B vitamins include folic acid, niacin, B6 and B12. When B vitamins are deficient, lethargy, irritability and depression can result. Eat more vitamin B6 rich foods each day, such as bananas, avocados, fish and dark green leafy vegetables to gain energy and feel better during a work day.

The key is to avoid sweets and to eat complex carbohydrates such as fiber-rich foods to enhance feelings of satiety to avoid overeating. Eat small healthy snacks over the course of the day, about every two hours or so between main meals. Nutritious snacks can thwart impulses to eat junk food and you might find you will naturally reduce portion sizes during main meal times. Having wholesome snacks readily available, such as in the glove compartment, office desk drawer or office fridge, might be helpful. Nutritious snacks include

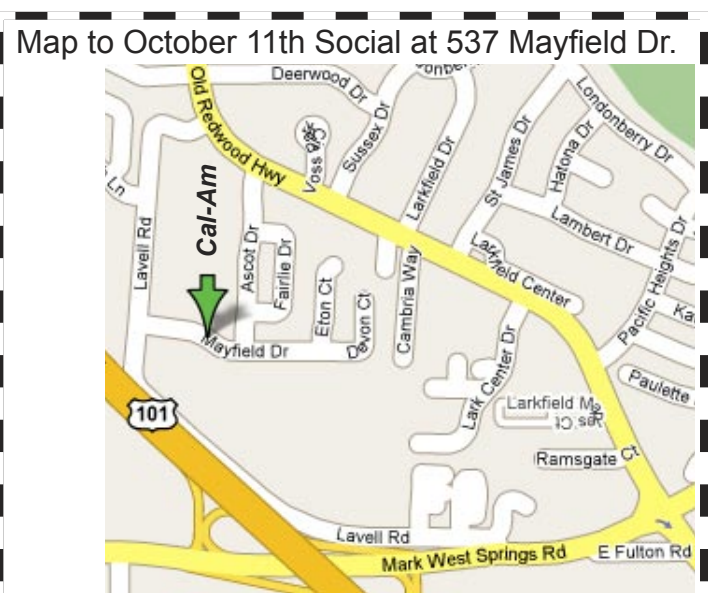
carrot sticks, a piece of fruit or a low-sugar yogurt. At work, take the stairs over the elevator, walk during breaks and park the car further from the office entrance to enjoy a walk. By all means, start an exercise and nutrition program after consulting with your physician to improve quality of life and health!

Adopting habits and measures that enhance work performance, yet inhibit the effects of stress, are important. These include:

- eating a healthy breakfast,
- reducing fat intake,
- eating more fiber,
- taking a moderate-dose multiple vitamin and mineral supplement of not more than 100 to 300 percent of the U.S. Daily Value,
- exercising,
- getting a minimum of seven hours of sleep per night,
- not working more than 10 hours per day,
- limiting alcohol consumption,
- drinking water often,
- avoiding tobacco, and
- thinking positive thoughts.

Take care of your health. Moreover, spend time laughing with loved ones and consult your medical professionals. Further, maintain proper nutrition, exercise regularly and get adequate sleep. Often we invest much time and money into maintaining our cars; let's remember to help our bodies and minds run efficiently and beautifully too!
